Illinois Plans June Trip To Vermont

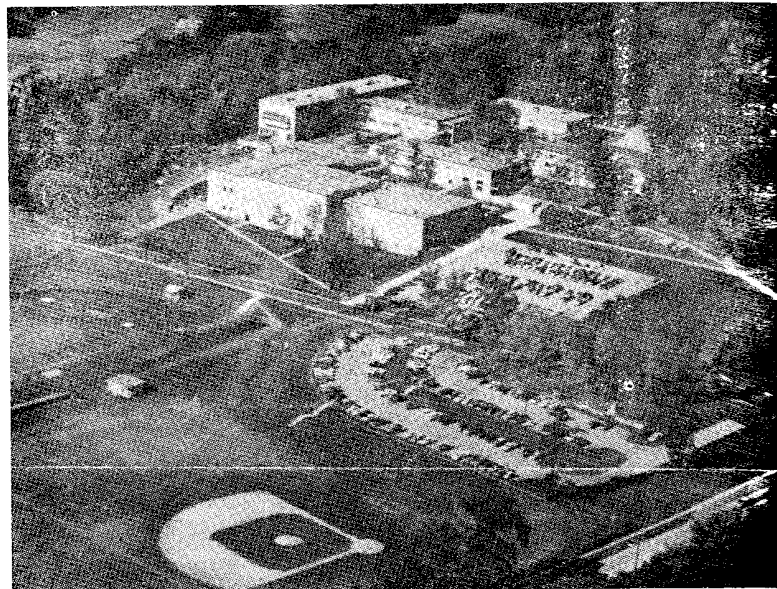

through New York. The return trip will be through Canada. Anyone wishing to apply for discussion leader or to attend from a school must apply at the Convention and sign up there. The remaining places in the Illinois quota will be filled by students and faculty from schools that did not have representatives at last year's convention.

Saturday the newly elected officers will be announced and will be installed. There is much more that happens at this convention when a group of interested students get together to discuss their problems and successes.

INTERNATIONAL UNDERSTANDING

This past summer, Alan Kaell spent two months in Israel. He went with the National Ramah Commission in a group of eighty boys and girls. Their first three weeks were spent in Jerusalem. It was here where they first came into contact with the ancient past. The 'old' city of Jerusalem and the "Wailing Wall" are historic sites to every religion.

At the Hebrew University they studied the society of Israel, but it was travelling all about the country where he really began to understand their life. In the Negev desert their bus would often stop to pick up soldiers — it is understood that the soldier is the most respected citizen and therefore one always surrenders his bus seat to the soldier. There were even co-ed's. In Israel, upon graduation from high school, boys and girls alike join the army to defend their country. (There is no draft system—they do not need it!) If you want to live there, you want to fight for your existence.

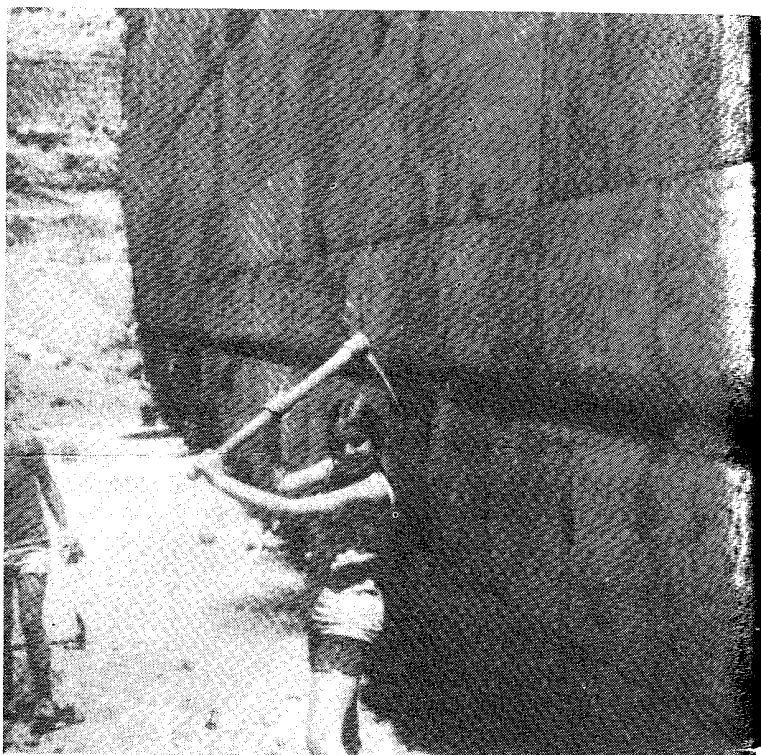
Alan said, "I never really understood the latter statement until I was in the Galilee area. Most of you have probably heard of the Golan Heights. Well, this is in the Galilee area. It was here where

Israel's enemy shot down upon the helpless woman and children of the kibbutz. Though defenseless, one can not help but feel that they died with dignity. Not to change the subject, but GREENERY — the Key Word. It is unbelievable what the Israelis have done with the desert area. By unique irrigation methods they have made the Negev inhabitable. It took people to build Israel — people like you and me. These people, however, are united. Israel is a nation fighting for its mere existence. Many people have compared Israel's communal, social society with America's—capitalistic and materialistic society. However, they fail to realize that our society was once a comparable agrarian society. Do we continue to believe in Jeffersonianism or do we continue to strive ahead? In other words let us encompass into our society our idealisms. Let this goal be pioneered by youth today. As I look at Israel today, I fear that they too

shall become a materialistic, corrupt society. A pessimist might consider this the end of the story and try to regress into that simple society where moral and ethical

values are easily determined and practiced. The optimist, however, will work to make our complex society simple in this way."

Summer Workshop Finds New Location

This year's Illinois State Student Council workshop will not be held in Monticello College as has been in the past. This year the workshop will be at McKendree College, Lebanon, Illinois. The workshop had to be moved because Monticello College was changed to a Junior College and the school will be remodeling the college for this reason.

The new site for the workshop has two air-conditioned dorms, each holding a hundred people.

There is also a swimming pool available and many lounge and gathering areas.

As was the policy last year, there will be no repeaters. Also this year there will be no repeating Junior Counselors. There will be two junior counselors per council.

It has been decided to raise the fees for the workshop to \$50.00 per delegate. Mr. Burton Showers will be consultant for the first week and Mr. Edmund Phelps will be

consultant for the second. The dates for the workshop are not definite because Illinois may sponsor a National workshop which would also occur in August. The national workshop would be either at McKendree College, Lebanon, Illinois, or East Bay Camp, Bloomington, Illinois.

The advanced workshop for the advisors will be held July 12 and the regular workshop for the advisors will be July 1-10.
